These watches have climbed back into the international elite, thanks to their technologically sophisticated yet traditional design.


## Electrifying the Wristwatch

The electrification of the watch led to massive upheaval in the watch industry as mechanical chronometers built by Old World masters developed into electromechanical devices mass produced in Asia. 
## Elgin Trench Watches of the Great War
